a. 2016 Tree Program Summary Serfling gave a brief report on the tree program.

3. Administrator's report

- a. Employee Recognition for Doug Keene for 30 years of service Rasmussen and the Board congratulated Keene on his 30 years of service to the SWCD. She presented him with a certificate and longevity pay.
- b. Root River One Watershed, One Plan
 The Planning Work Group will meet next Tuesday to go over the final draft of the
 plan which will be forwarded on to the Policy and Advisory committee for their
 review. The plan will then go on to the state agencies for approval. The Joint
 Powers Agreement is out for comments by county attorneys and administrators.
 A public hearing is expected to be held in September with hopes that the plan
 will be approved by the end of the year.

c. Buffer implementation

A meeting was held to develop the next steps in the buffer implementation process. A mailing list will be developed of those landowners affected checking for compliance, a compliance due date and how it affects cropping in 2017. The County is in the process of changing their Shoreland Ordinance so that it is consistent with the State Buffer Law rules. Online surveys are being developed, multi-county meetings with BWSR are being planned, and BWSR is developing a buffer tool to track compliance.

d. Ag Water Quality Certification Program
Three applications have been received and two have been certified for the
AWQCP. Those who expressed interest are being contacted to encourage them
to submit an application before the end of the month. Seven more applications
are needed to meet the goal for the BWSR grant which ends at the end of the
month. Radio ads are running to promote the program.

- e. Local Capacity Grant supplemental funds Nothing new to report.
- f. Conservation Corp Apprentice update Dylan Kline has turned down the position as CC apprentice. The other area candidates are being contacted to see if they want it. This will push the start date back to May 31st.

4. NRCS

Bronson reported the Local Workgroup Meeting has been scheduled for May 23rd. Rebecca Christianson, an Altima employee, has started and will be assisting with clerical work. Staff is working on CSP and the CRP workload.

Bronson expressed her disapproval of the proposed letter to NRCS regarding the SWCD Board's disappointment in the delays in the EQIP signup process that caused contract cancellations for spring construction. This will be addressed at the Local Workgroup meeting.
