1. Supervisor's activity reports

Willford reported coming in for the statement opening and check detail, attended a Building Committee meeting regarding telephone and operational and cooperative working agreements. He also attended a Personnel Committee meeting.

Hazel reported attending a Personnel Committee meeting.

Gossman reported attending a Building Committee meeting and a Forestry Committee meeting. He also reported visiting the Lost Creek Hiking Trail with Madeline Snyder, Conservation Corp apprentice, to make plans to update the SWCD signs and brochure.

Pickett reported attending a Forestry Committee meeting and an Education Committee meeting.

Tesmer reported attending the Hiawatha RC&D meeting on May 22 and attended an Education Committee meeting.

Staff reports

A written report was included in the board packets.

Administrator's report

Rasmussen introduced Madeline Snyder, the Conservation Corp intern.

Snyder left the meeting at 4:35 p.m.

a. 2018 funding update

Rasmussen reported the Local Capacity Grants will be the same as last year in the amount of \$100,000.00 plus the additional funding based on whatever increase is received from the County with a maximum of \$14,000.00. Funding for the Buffer law remains at \$30,000.00 which is the same as last year. There will also be funds for establishment of buffers, but expects the demand will be low as many have already done their seeding. Base grants remain the same. Funding for One Watershed One Plan will be available, but funding levels aren't known yet. Competitive grant funding will be reduced for 2017.

b. DNR Energy Funds for the Conservation Building

Rasmussen reported DNR had \$300 to be used for Energy Conservation. It was used to replace the weather stripping around the overhead doors.

c. MDA postcard mailing

MDA has received funding to mail postcards with information from the Field to Stream Project to farmers in the watershed. At least two more cards will be sent. The next card will have nitrogen information.

d. Crop residue survey report

The crop residue survey was completed on May 9th-12th which was a follow-up to imagery taken on May 7th. Thomas and Christenson assisted. Two hundred of the 300 points were completed before moving on to another county.

e. 75th anniversary update

Rasmussen reported on the progress of the Conservation Tour and meal. A brochure for the bus tour is being finalized. MASWCD, BWSR, NRCS will all have a few words after the meal.

The SWCD will be participating at the Gammel Dag parade, Dairy Night on the Farm, Cattlemen's Steak Fry, Fourth of July Parades in Cherry Grove and Harmony, and Fillmore County Fair which are all coming up in the next few weeks. The Prairie Walk has been scheduled for August.

4. NRCS

Bronson reported she was processing payments, working on status reviews, and dealing with compliance and violation issues.

5. County

a. Buffer update

Bakke reported the County had adopted the resolution opting to handle the enforcement for the Buffer Law. He said it was a "reluctant" vote as the Commissioners weren't sure what they were getting into.

The County is continuing to deal with the Amish septic system law suit. It started in Fillmore County, went to the State level and is now coming back to Fillmore County. They have been told to come into compliance.

Koliha reported on the concerns of the County in regards to adding more buffer areas with the possible outcome of them being mandated and having addition regulations. The SWCD is mandated to identify "other waters" or justify why they aren't identified.

Three versions of the "other waters" resolution were presented for Supervisor review:

- one with "other waters" in map format
- one with "other waters" in descriptive format
- one stating the "other waters" may already be identified in the One Watershed One Plan implementation plan.

Motioned by Hazel seconded by Tesmer to approve the resolution to adopt the One Watershed One Plan version of "Other Waters" for inclusion in the Local Water Management plan. Affirmative: Hazel, Gossman, Pickett, Tesmer, Willford. Opposed: none. Motion carried.

Bronson left the meeting at 4:55 p.m.
