Draft Implementation Policies (see attached): The draft policies were reviewed and edited. Some final changes will be completed by Daryl. It was the consensus to set up the sub-agreements like Ag Certainty and initially give \$2500 to each county and request more if needed.

Conservation Planning Initiative update: Mary Peterson, BWSR: Mary will work with Dave Walter on the work plan and budget in eLINK when the final budget is determined. Dan will be ³/₄ time conservation planning and Bob, Dave, Jean and Janice will make up the remaining ³/₄. BWSR will cash flow the grant anticipating NRCS reimbursement. Grant funds will be received using the 50/40/10 distribution normally used. The grant will be about \$275,000 for three years (July 1, 2018-June 30, 2021). There is some discussion about the Cedar planner taking the Mower portion of the Root. Six of the seven watersheds have met. Yellow Medicine has been added for a total of 8-HUC8s. The initiative is just for the Root River watershed not the 1W1P planning area. Mary met with NRCS to refine the Contribution Agreement deliverables, and some were decreased while others were increased based on the input Mary received from the meetings. Analysis will include identifying all eligible landowners and priority areas in the watersheds (major and minor--not just MRBI watersheds). Evaluation will involve three annual reports to NRCS and a progress report every six months. There will be two workshops per year in the Root River watershed to promote and train landowners on conservation planning.
