

Outputs and Outcomes

<u>Outputs</u>: Five waterways (total of 9.79 acres) and one sediment basin were installed in 2010 using funding from FY2010. In 2011, FY10 grant funds were used to install 2 grassed waterways (3,985 feet total), one farmstead windbreak, and for one well decommissioning

Remaining funds are encumbered in a contract for a sediment basin.

Outcomes:

Water pollution reduction estimates for these projects: Reduction in Soil Loss = 115 tons per year



Purpose of a grassed waterway:

- To convey runoff from terraces, diversions or other water concentrations without causing erosion or flooding.
- To reduce gully erosion.
- To improve water quality.
