

Outputs and Outcomes

<u>Outputs</u>: One well decommissioning, one waterway (3100 feet) and one terrace restoration (2100 feet) were completed in 2013. Treated acres = 17.2.

In 2014, 2 grassed waterways (2100' total), one terrace with underground tile (2150'), 3 farmstead windbreaks, and 1 well decommissioning were completed.

The remaining funds are encumbered in 3 contracts for grassed waterways.

2015: Three grassed waterways (4,682' total) completed. Outcomes:

Water pollution reduction estimates for projects completed: Reduction in Soil Loss = 98.75 T/year



Waterway needs are often evident after a rain event. A waterway's purpose is to:

- convey runoff from terraces, diversions or other water concentrations without causing erosion or flooding.
- reduce gully erosion.
- improve water quality.

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
